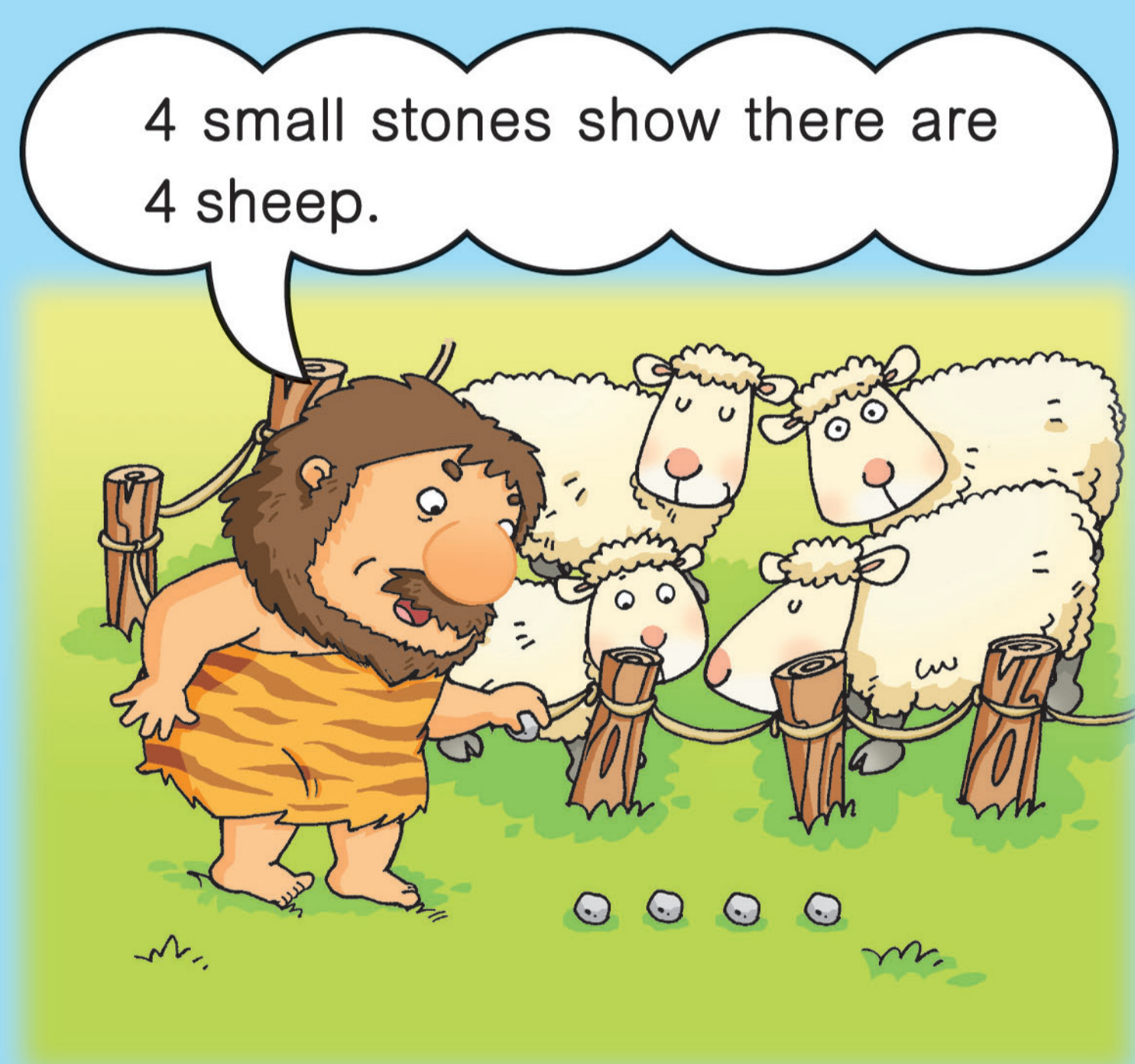
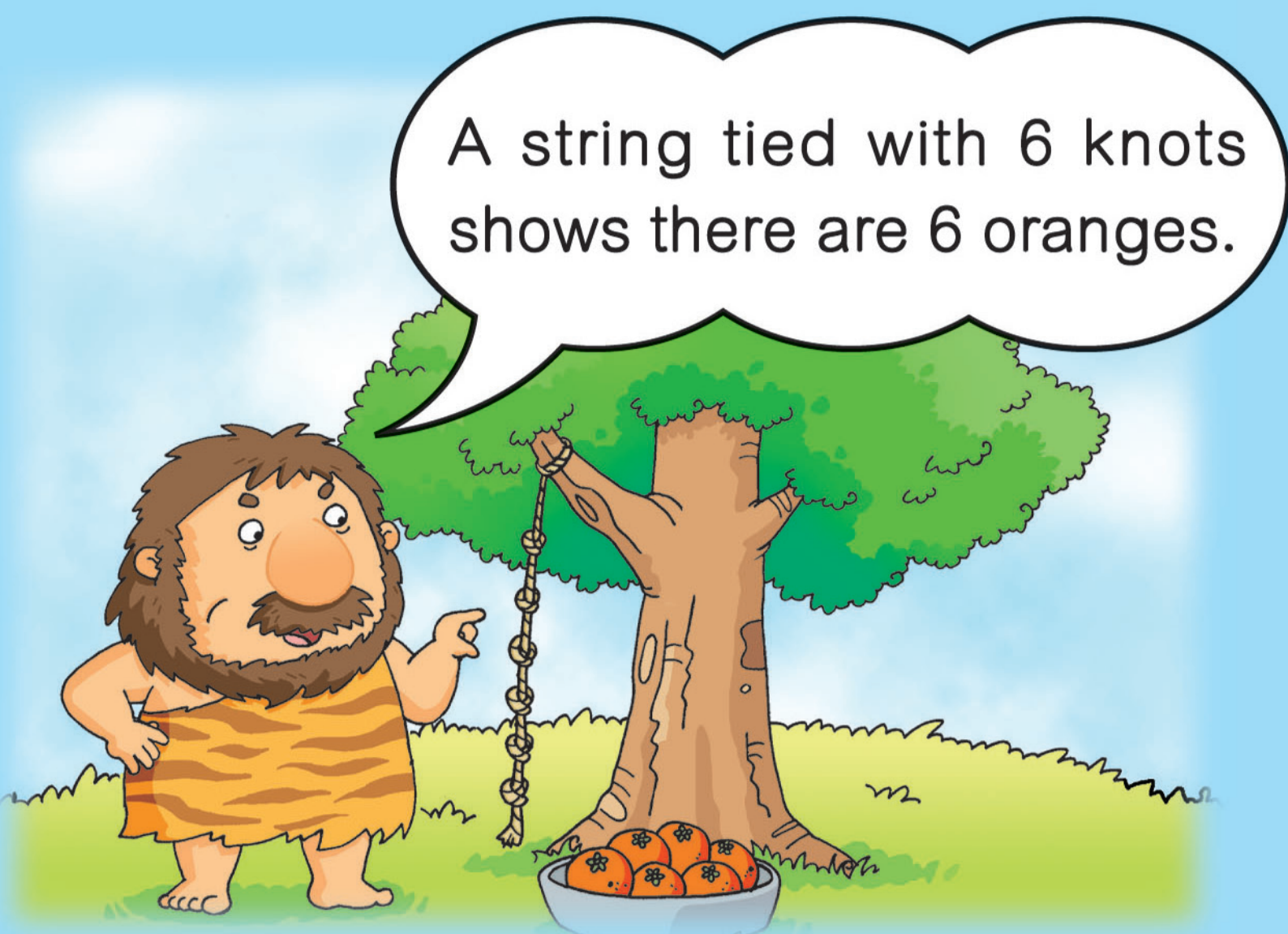


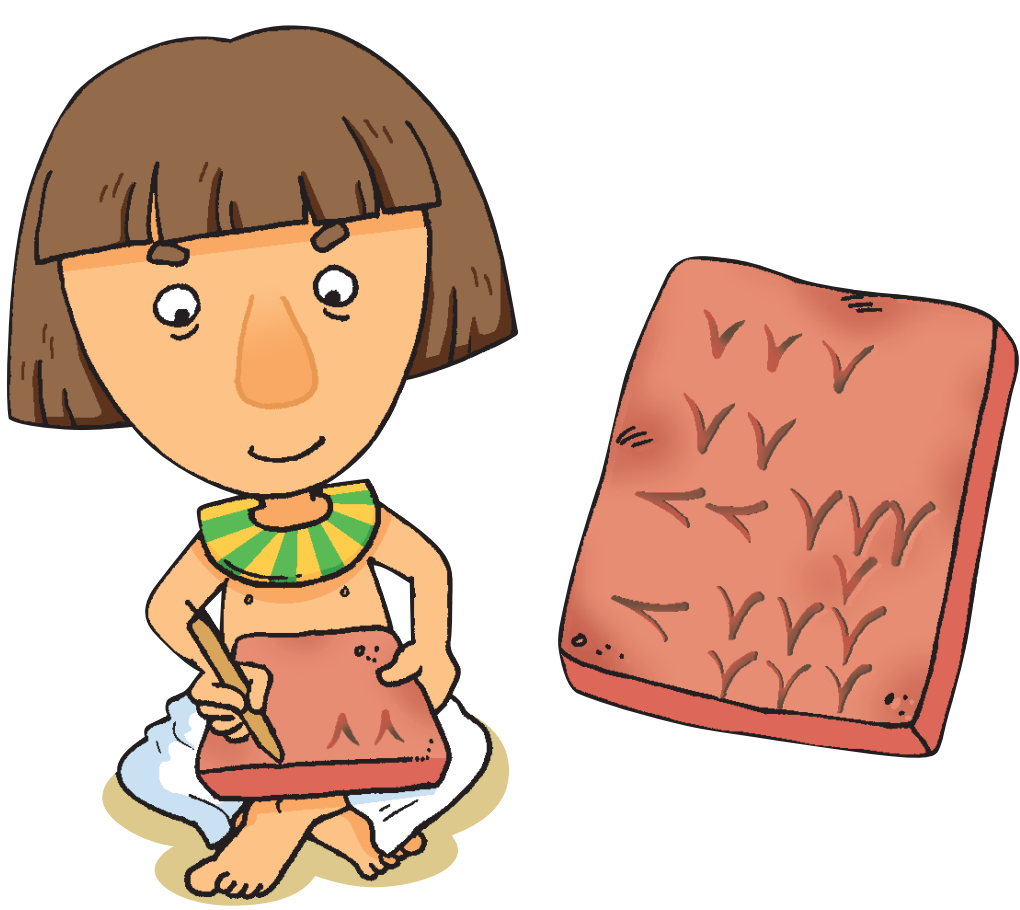
Different ways to record numbers

Babylonians



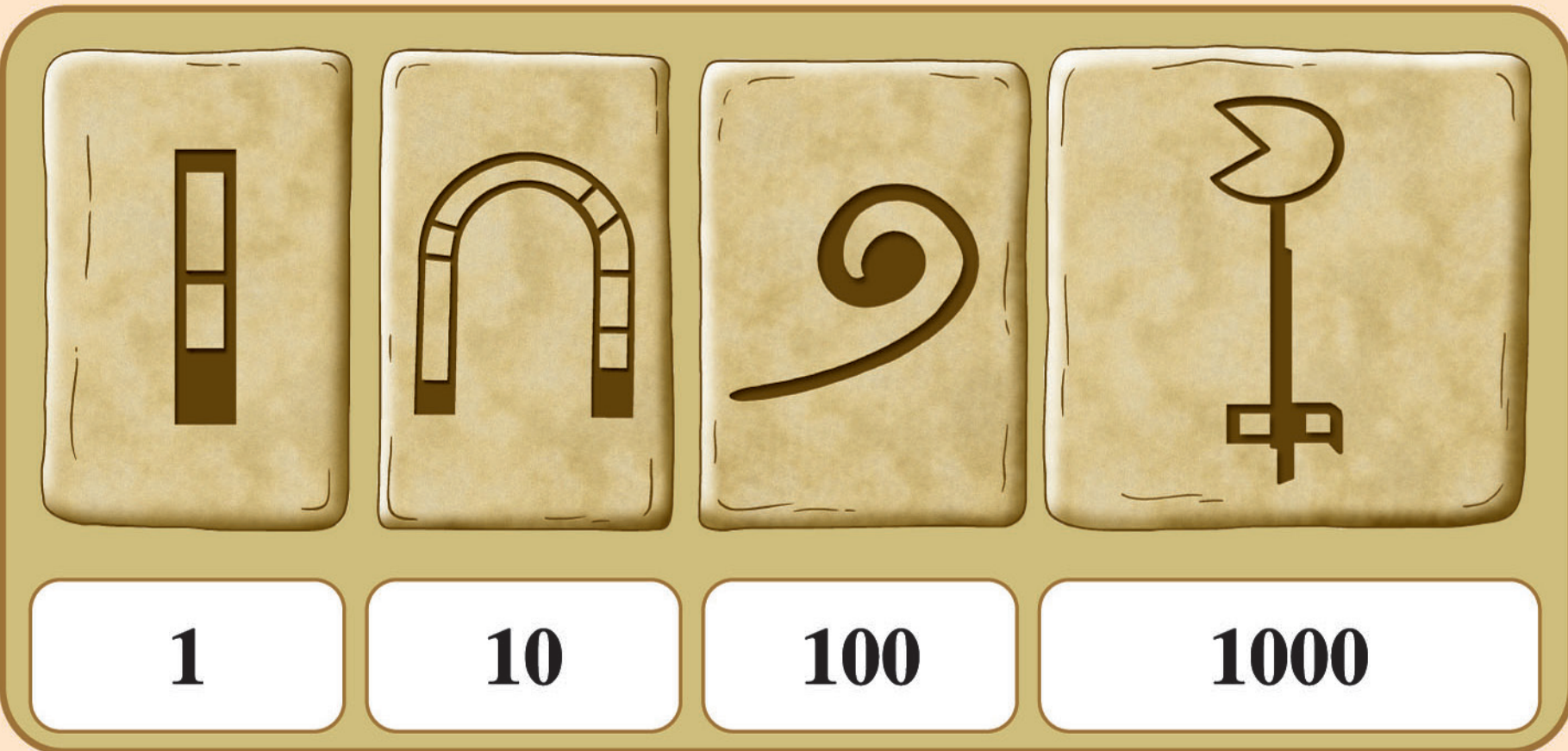
Indians
